A medical establishment functions best when all employees work together peacefully, but there may sometimes be disagreements in your workplace. Your conflict resolution and leadership skills should help diffuse the situation and get everybody back to working as a team. Example: "Nurses are human, so it's normal for tensions to flare up sometimes. When that happens, I would meet the people involved and try to broker an acceptable solution.

Descriptive and inferential statistics were used to examine the relationship between workplace setting and conflict resolution style.
