This body was abolished in 1806, when, until 1817, it was merged with the Navy's Transport Board. Thereafter, the Royal Navy managed men's health and medical facilities both afloat and ashore via medical commissioners sitting on the wider Victualling Board, until reorganized once more in 1832 when a specific Medical Department was created.
